

From I-5 N, merge onto Hwy 18 E (exit

#142A) toward Auburn & North Bend.

Exit to Maple Valley Hwy 169.

Right on SE 232nd St Right on Maple

Valley Hwy 169.

Right on Witte Rd SE.

Left on SE 248th St.

Go around the roundabout and turn right

on SE 24th St.

Arboretum entrance is straight ahead

Parking lot is left of the entrance

South from Seattle

From I-5 in Tukwila, merge onto

I-405 N (exit #154A) toward Renton.

Merge onto Maple Valley Hwy 169 (exit #4).

Right on Witte Rd SE in Maple Valley.

Left on SE 248th St.

Go around the roundabout and turn right on SE 248th St.

Arboretum entrance is straight ahead.

Parking lot is left of the entrance

From Wilderness Village on

Valley Hwy 169


Go west 1 mile on Kent-Kangley

Meeting called to order at 7:02

The meeting was held at Bob Pattie's house so that a tour of the shop could occur. Bob purchased a generator that could power lighting and equipment in the shop. There are leaks in the canvas that covers the shop so a new one will need to be purchased. The remaining buckets of rocks could be covered with a tarp or with plywood. A proposal was made to open the shop for 1 night a week, probably on Tuesdays from 4-8. This will be proposed at the general meeting. Fees will be \$5 for members and \$10 for non-members at the discretion of the board. The fee would be waived for members working in the shop. Use of the big saw will be \$5 per hour for members and \$10 for non-members.

The monthly storage fee of \$220 has been paid. Diana got new business cards for the club to help with advertising. A non-member bought 2 buckets of club rock from storage.

The club potluck picnic will be held on Sunday August 14 with set-up at 11:00 and eating to begin at noon. There will be no September board meeting due to Labor Day. Since the club has sold much of the surplus equipment a new inventory is needed. This will be performed on a future weekend date.

There have been some issues with the website server that Mark is working on. More people are continuing to view. No issues have been determined by BECU for accepting payments through the website. Changing the fees for membership with the option of \$20 for a single and \$30 for a family was discussed with a decision postponed to a future meeting. Also discussed and postponed was a proposal to only allow paid members to be eligible for certain benefits such as first crack at equipment for sale. A proposal was accepted to amend the by-laws to provide free dues for the Tumbler editor and field trip chairperson. This will be brought to the general meeting for club approval. Ideas to replace the income lost if we do not participate in selling material at the Puyallup Club rock show next year was discussed. This could be having a small 2 day show next year with 15-20 dealers. We could potentially participate in the Puyallup Club show next year too.

The last field trip had 25 people attend. Next month it will be an optional overnighter to Greenwater for Mt. Tahoma agate. CMS field trips are now listed on the WSMC website.

The next meeting will be August 8 at Panera Bread in Kent.




